Olympic flame arrives in the port of Marseille




The final highlight came from the teens, who performed a powerful mime of the life of Jesus.

The retreat for Frenchspeaking churches featured all current teachers in the CEM program teaching one of their classes. We had great participation, the Centre was filled!




Family & Friends

The rest of the time, Katie and I serve together with our multiple children in the faith in Marseille.




